SCHOLASTICS, SPORTSMANSHIP AND ATHLETIC (SSA) SCHOLARSHIP

HISTORY:

These scholarships recognize students who are well rounded and have excelled in all three areas during their high school career. This scholarship has been awarded annually, beginning in 1951. There were 8 FWISD high schools then and only one scholarship in the amount of \$250 was awarded.

PURPOSE:

The Optimist Club of Fort Worth's **Scholastics, Sportsmanship and Athletic (SSA) Scholarships** are to be given annually to graduating seniors from a Fort Worth ISD high school who exhibit outstanding qualities as scholars, sportsmen and athletes and meet the requirements set out below.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ELIGIBILITY

To qualify for the scholarship, the winner must:

- 1. Have completed academically for all four (4) years in a Fort Worth ISD high school and be in the top 25% of their graduating class;
- 2. Have maintained an unblemished record for sportsmanship on the athletic field and in contact with coaches, game officials and opposing players and teammates; and
- 3. Have engaged in athletics for at least two of the last three years.
