75th Diamond Anniversary - SSA Presentation SCHOLASTICS, SPORTSMANSHIP & ATHLETICS SCHOLARSHIP May 2, 2025

HISTORY and PURPOSE: These scholarships recognize a senior student/athlete from each of the 14 FWISD high schools who is well rounded and has excelled in all three areas during their high school career. This scholarship has been awarded annually, beginning in 1951. There were 8 FWISD high schools then and only one scholarship in the amount of \$250 was awarded. Today we will award \$30,000 in scholarships to these 14 outstanding student athletes. First place: \$10,000, second place: \$6,000, third place: \$3000. All finalists #11-14 receive a \$1000 scholarship.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ELIGIBILITY:

To qualify for the scholarship, the winner must:

- 1. Have completed all four (4) years in a Fort Worth ISD high school and be in the top 15% academically of their graduating class,
- 2. Have maintained an unblemished record for sportsmanship on the athletic field and in contact with coaches, game officials and opposing players and teammates, and
- 3. Have been engaged in athletics for at least two of the last three years.
